### 8. Unfinished business:

**a.** As for the final decision on streaming council meetings, Mayor asked for a motion on approving or not. No councilmember made a motion either way, so therefore, this matter died for lack of a motion.

**b.** As for the matter of the alleys, no decision was made. One suggestion proposed was for the city to place a load of crushed concrete down at the sewer plant for residents to use for their alley. This was only a suggestion and was not approved at this time.

### 9. New Business:

**a.** Department Head Reports: Brekke suggested that instead of he and Larson being together on Sewer and Water that he (Brekke) oversee Water and Larson oversee Sewer. All agreed.

**b.** Brekke made a motion and Larson seconded to approve a 3% raise for the city employees. The following amounts were suggested pending on approval of Resolution 2024-08 that will be presented at the next regular Council meeting: Peg Copple-an increase of \$.54 per hour for a new hourly wage of \$18.53; Candy Lloyd-an increase of \$.61 per hour for a new hourly wage of \$20.85; David Meyers-an increase of \$.66 per hour for a new hourly wage of \$22.64; Derek Morris-an increase of \$.72 per hour for a new hourly wage of \$24.72; Todd Wilson-an increase of \$1,635.59 for a new annual salary of \$56,155.84; Dixie Iverson-an increase of \$1,540.99 for a new annual salary of \$52,906.10.

**c.** Mitchell made a motion and Brekke seconded to accept the proposal from Steinhoff Construction to replace the curb and gutter and placing concrete on the easement at the corner of 5<sup>th</sup> and Evans St. along with ADA placements at the street/sidewalk areas. No further discussion. All ayes...MC

**d.** The Council all agreed to reimbursement residents affected by the backup from a sewer line on North Shannon.

### 10. Updates from City Clerk:

**a.** A tree at 201 Barnard St is dead and will be removed from the city easement. Also 2 trees in the City Park will be removed.

b. The Annual Lander's Ball Tournament will be held on July 13<sup>th</sup>.
